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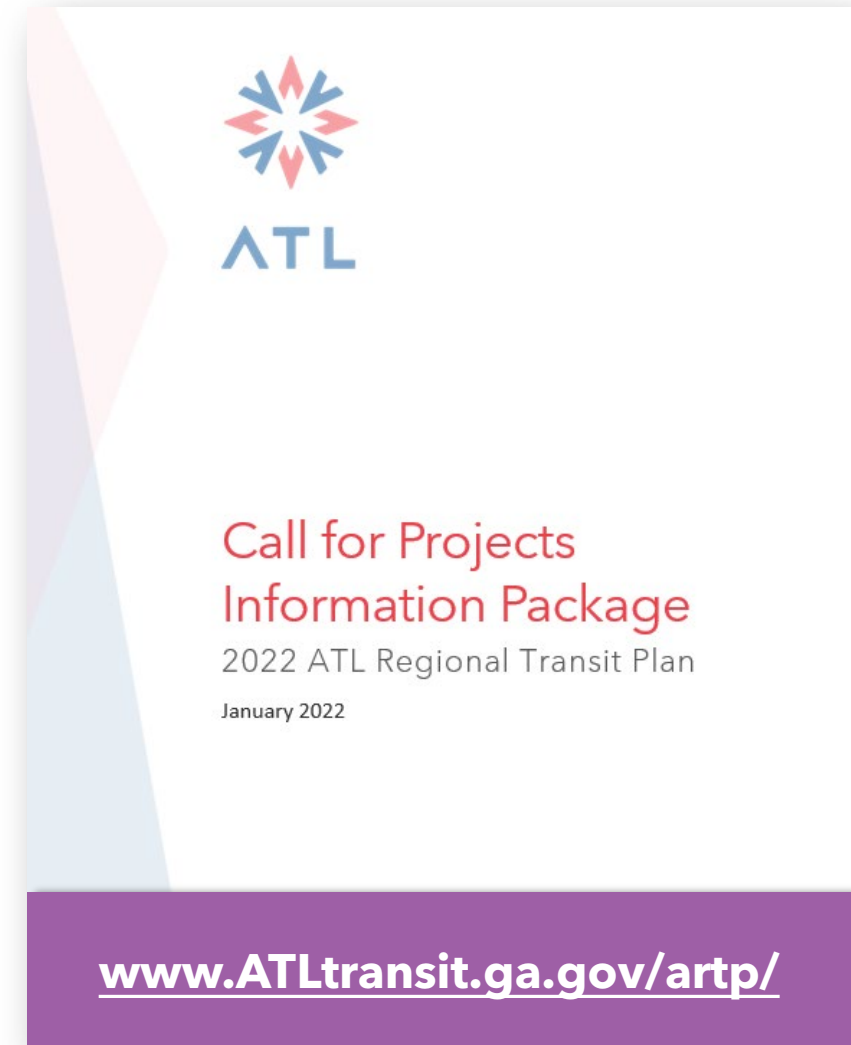

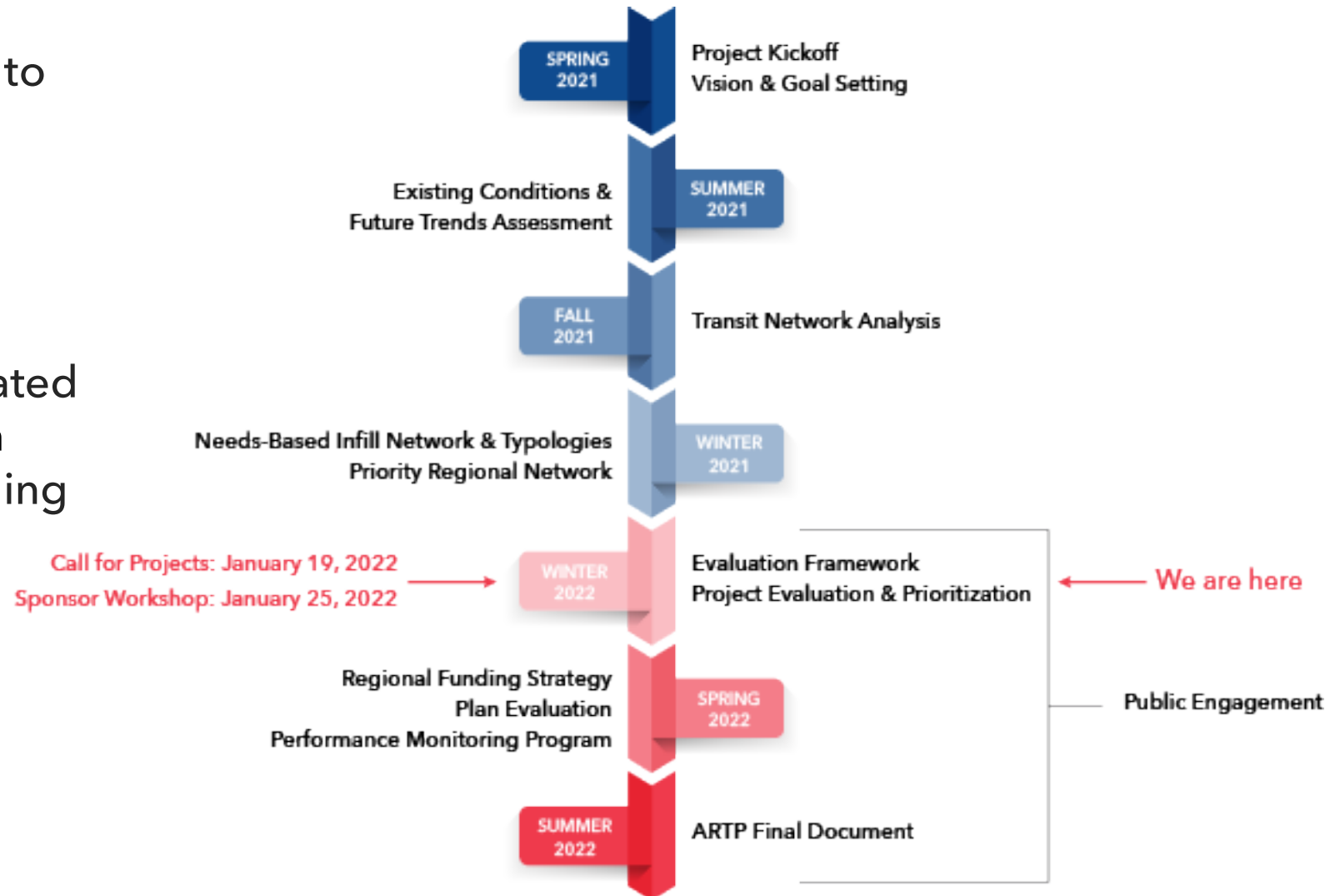

# OVERVIEW AND TIMELINE

- Call for Projects open January 19 to March 4, 2022
- Online submittal of individual projects by sponsors through TrackATL
- Submitted projects will be evaluated to inform the short and long-term project lists and the regional funding strategy

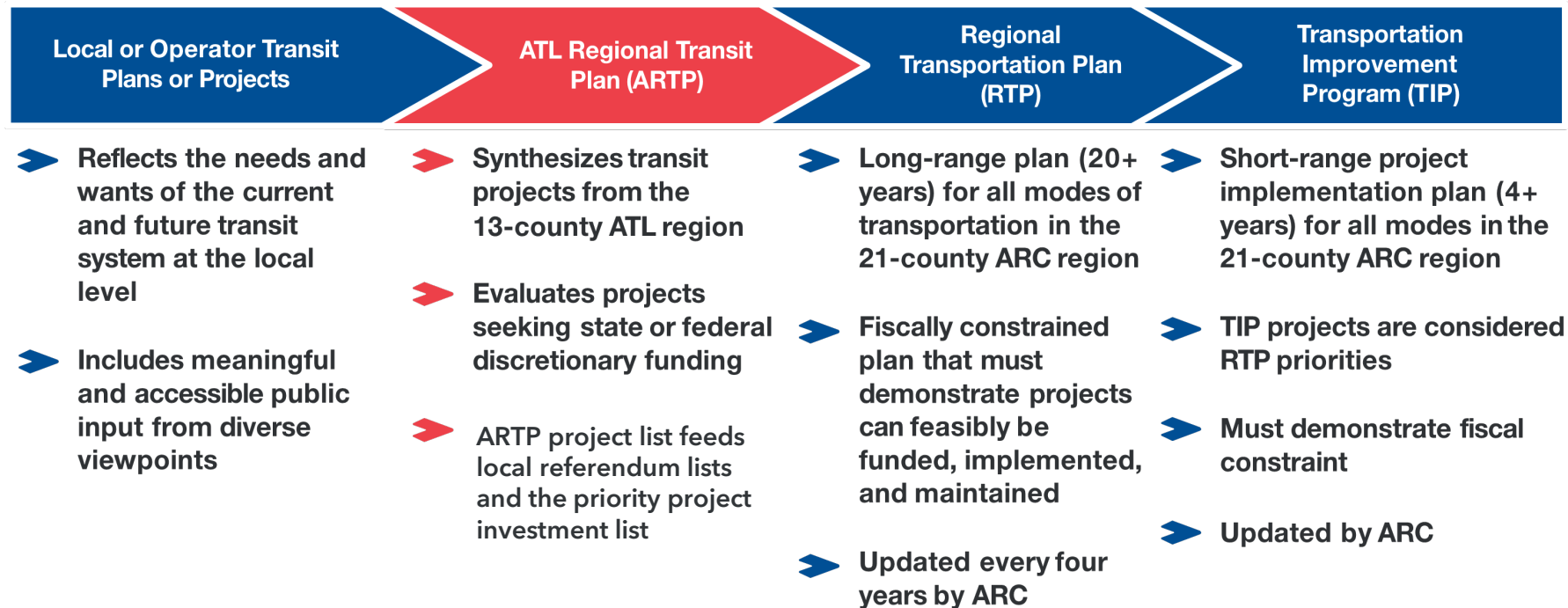




# OVERVIEW AND TIMELINE

## ► Projects in the ARTP:

- Evaluates projects seeking federal discretionary funding
- Informs projects in county-level transit SPLOST referenda
- Informs projects considered for state funding
- Serves as primary source of transit projects for the RTP/TIP

# EVALUATION & PRIORITIZATION FRAMEWORK

## ► Step 1: Policy Consideration

- To inform how projects are prioritized and help to identify appropriate funding source(s)
  1. Is the project spatially consistent with the Priority Regional Transit Network?
  2. Does the project address a regional transit need identified in the Network Analysis?
  3. Is the project in a locally adopted plan?

## ► Step 2: Performance Evaluation and Scores

- Based on project type: Expansion, Enhancement, State of Good Repair and Systemwide
- Criteria build on Network Analysis framework that aligns with ATL's Governing Principles & ARTP vision
- Relative Cost to Impacts Analysis - Cost Effectiveness Quadrants

## ► Step 3: Final Factors

- Consideration of deliverability, regional equity, and stakeholder support to supplement performance scores to inform final list of priority projects

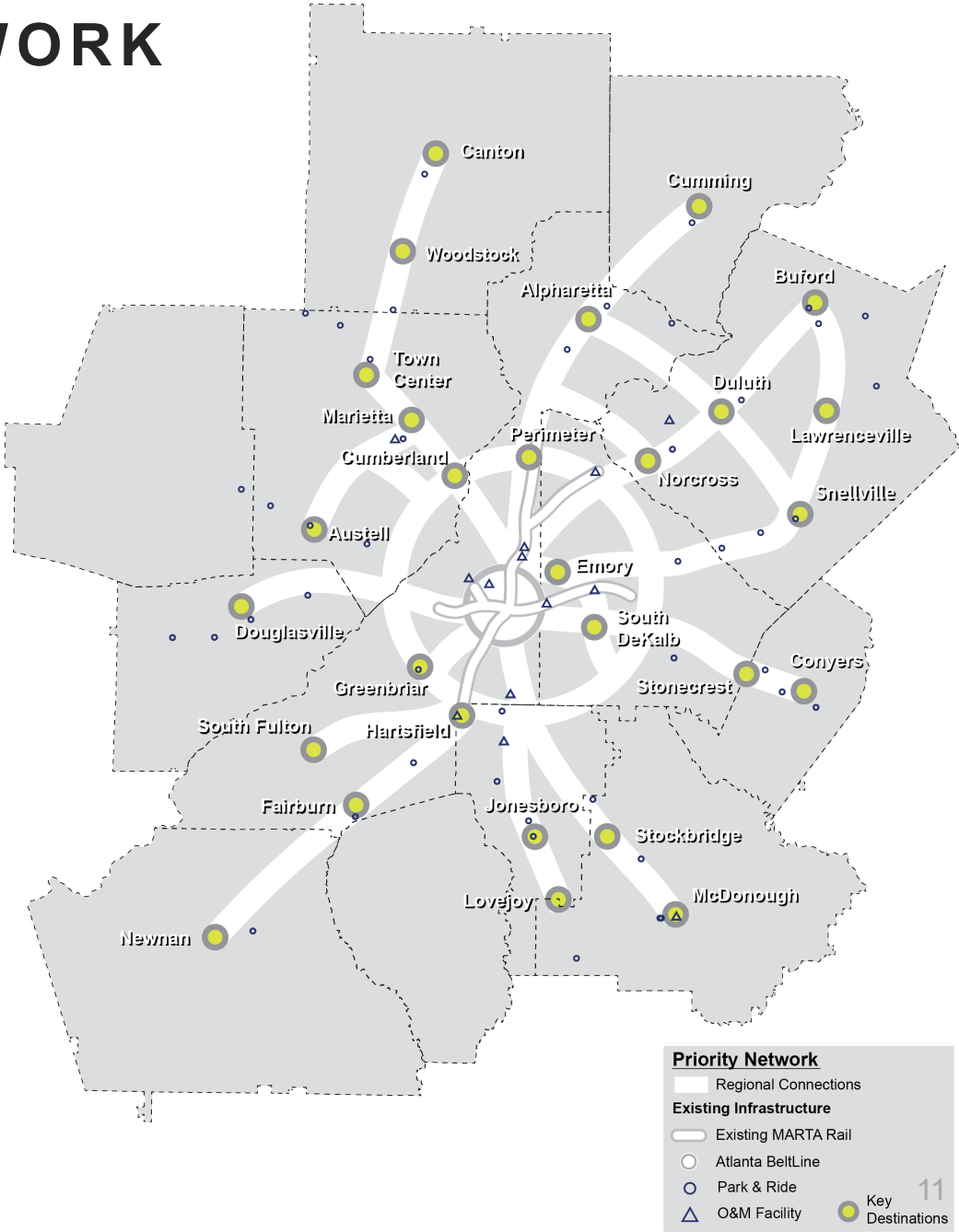

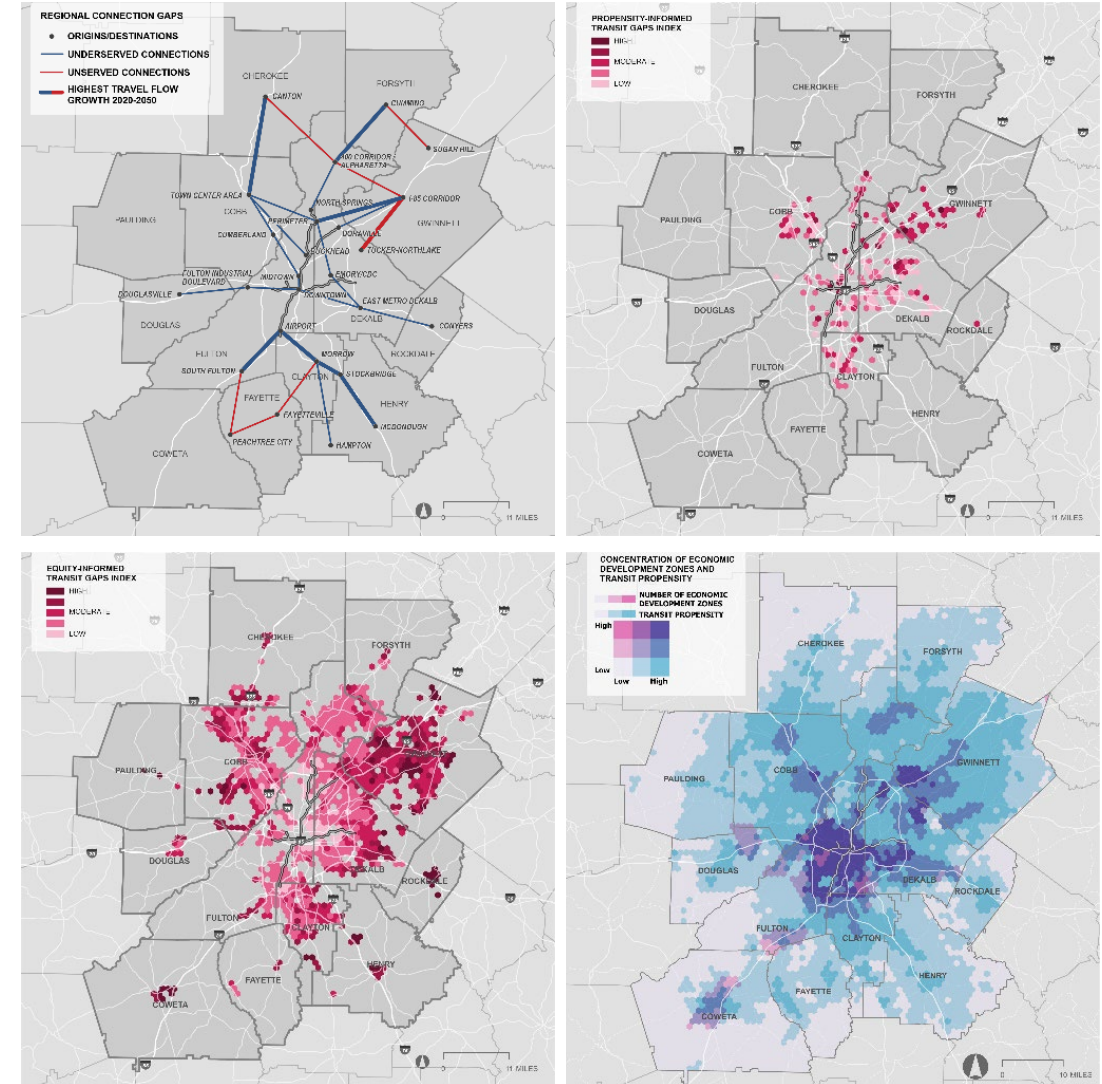
# PRIORITY REGIONAL TRANSIT NETWORK

Criteria	Measures
Promote Regional Connectivity and Address Transit Need	Connect counties, transit systems, activity centers, intermodal facilities, and provide critical network linkages
	Serve high transit propensity areas and historically underserved communities
Build Upon Utility of Prior Studies and Efforts	<p>Recognize extent of prior efforts and community support</p> <p>Consider project development phase, timeline, and funding commitment</p>
Optimize Project Delivery Timeframe	Leverage other transportation investments that may lower cost or provide additional funding
	Minimize right-of-way impacts and environmental concerns



# NETWORK ANALYSIS

- Comprehensive regional network analysis to identify unmet transit gaps and needs across the region
- Evaluates the regional transit system's alignment with key topic areas:
  - Mobility and Connectivity
  - Equity
  - Economic Development
  - Safety, Efficiency, and Resiliency

# TRACKATL OVERVIEW

- ▶ Web-based project database
- ▶ Public-facing portal for project querying
- ▶ Project sponsors can view and download data at any time
- ▶ Each agency can have multiple users updating and submitting project data
- ▶ Submit for approval function creates a feedback loop between project sponsors and ATL staff
- ▶ ATL can review project information, check for completeness, return submittal with comments
- ▶ Able to run reports (e.g., by project type, funding year, funding source)
- ▶ Mapping component reduces need to migrate data between database and ArcMap



# PROJECT SUBMISSION/REVIEW PROCESS

► Projects must be submitted individually

► Project Submittal Status:

- Draft – Project Sponsor is working towards submittal
- Pending Review - Submitted projects awaiting ATL staff review
- Denied – ATL reviewer will provide sponsor with clarification of denial
- Accepted – Good to go!

If a required question is left blank, you will not be able to submit

# NEXT STEPS

- ▶ Through March 4, 2022: begin/continue submitting your projects
  - Delete project, make changes or add information, and resubmit if needed
  - Utilize TrackATL and ATL Staff for help
- ▶ After March 4, 2022: ATL will evaluate submitted projects based on the framework outlined today and reach out to sponsors with any questions
- ▶ Through Summer 2022: Re-engage county officials, transit operators, state-level partners, CIDs, and the public to develop:
  - Prioritized list of projects, programs and recommendations
  - Regional funding strategy
- ▶ August 2022: Present ARTP to the ATL Board for adoption

- ▶ Can I upload multiple projects at one time?
- ▶ Can multiple people's logins be used contribute to one organization's submittal or does it all have to be done under one account?
- ▶ Can I upload ArcGIS shapefiles of the projects instead of using the hand mapping tool?
- ▶ How will I know if my submittals have been accepted or approved?
- ▶ What if I don't have all the required answers? For example, my County may not go to referendum so some of these projects do not have an anticipated construction date.
