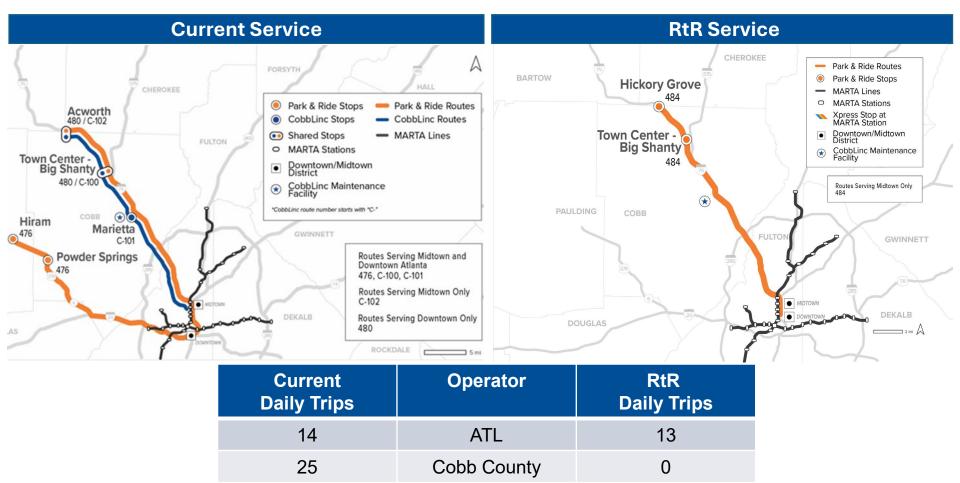

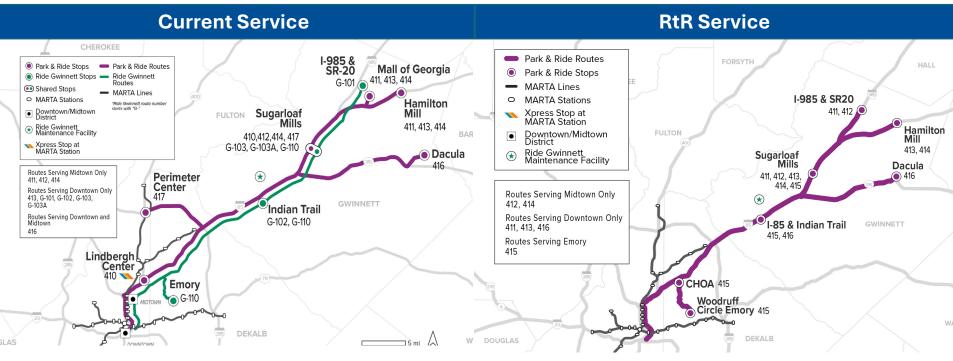

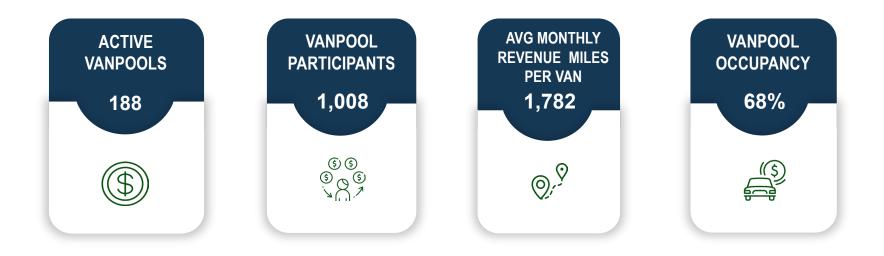

Vanpool Program Overview



- ATL manages a turnkey contract with Commute with Enterprise for Regional Vanpool Services
- ATL's contract with Enterprise is 100% federally funded and provides a subsidy amount of 40% of the total vanpool cost
- Vanpools must be 50% full for 14 days of the month to qualify for a subsidy

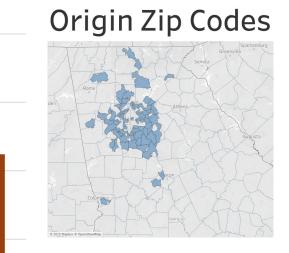

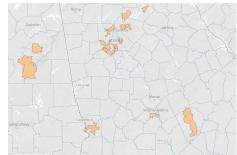

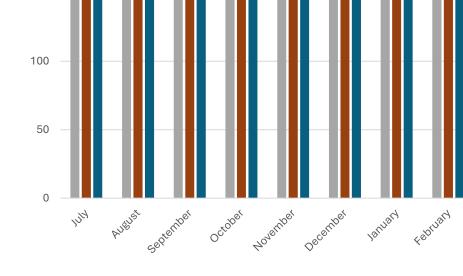

FY26 Budget Adoption

FY26 ATL Budget Highlights

► FY25 budget review

- \$4M reduction in State Appropriations for Xpress Commuter Service
 - "Reduce funds to reflect efficiencies in commuter bus services in metro Atlanta, including coordination with local transit providers and streamlined options for riders"
 - "The Atlanta-region Transit Link (ATL) Authority shall develop an operational plan to downsize Xpress commuter service commensurate with multi-county transit demand, and begin enacting new service levels in FY 2025"

► FY26 ATL budget

- Implements direction from FY25 budget by reflecting cost efficiency reductions in Xpress service from Redefine the Ride service changes
- Increases Planning Program to support studies and initiatives to be completed over multiple years
- Capital investments into state-owned park-and-ride lots and to ensure quality customer experience as part of Redefine the Ride implementation

Leverages new fund sources

- Contributions from Cobb and Gwinnett Counties to Xpress Service
- Transit Trust Fund (TTF) interest to support administration of the TTF Program



FY26 Budget Highlights – Xpress Program

Operations Budget Highlights

- 32% decrease in FY26 Xpress service contracts (Transdev and Cobb) due to upcoming Redefine the Ride Service changes
 - \$14.6M in FY25 to \$10.0M in FY26
- 15% decrease in total Xpress operating budget
 - \$25M in FY25 to \$21.2M in FY26
- Receiving new fund sources to support streamlined Regional Commuter Service (pending Board Approval)
 - Gwinnett County Xpress Contribution \$2.6M
 - Cobb County Xpress Contribution \$393K

Capital Budget Highlights

- Capital budget is for park-and-ride maintenance and South Operations Facility Bus Wash replacement
 - Current leased lots need to be repaired to level at which they were first leased
 - State-owned lots require State of Good Repair updates in FY26
 - South Operations Facility Bus Wash Replacement



FY26 Budget Highlights – Planning Program

Increase in FY26 budget due to obligation of funds for several multi-year planning contracts beginning in and being fully budgeted within FY26

- 2026 ATL Regional Transit Plan (ARTP) (State requirement)
- Xpress In-Person Employment Center (IPEC) Transit Study Phase 1 & 2
- Regional Transit Asset Management (TAM) Plan Update (Federal requirement)
- ATL Transit Report (State requirement)
- Regional Vanpool Program Analysis
- Regional Technology Program Study

Funded with 80% federal funds

ATL's Formula Grant Submission

Federal formula funds are allocated annually through federal programs from the Federal Transit Administration (FTA)

- Urbanized Area Formula Program: Section 5307
- Bus Facilities Formula Grants: Section 5339(a)

ATL will submit a new grant application for FY26 5307 and 5339(a) formula funds

If ATL does not draw down funds in a timely manner, they may lapse to be reallocated to other regions or agencies



ATL FY26 Grant Application - 5307

Section 5307 eligible uses include regional planning, capital cost of contracting, preventive maintenance, mobility management, project administration, and capital needs

► ATL will submit a request for \$8.7M, to FTA which will support

- \$4.9M will support Xpress Services
 - Preventive maintenance
 - Capital Cost of Contracting for Vanpool and Xpress service delivery (Transdev and Enterprise contracts)
- \$3.8M will support multi-year Regional Planning contracts
 - In-Person Employment Center (IPEC) Study
 - Atlanta Regional Transit Plan (ARTP)



ATL FY26 Grant Application - 5339(a)

Section 5339(a) eligible uses include vehicle replacements, equipment, technology upgrades, and capital expenditures

ATL will submit a request to FTA in the amount of \$1,036,000 to support Xpress operations and maintenance
